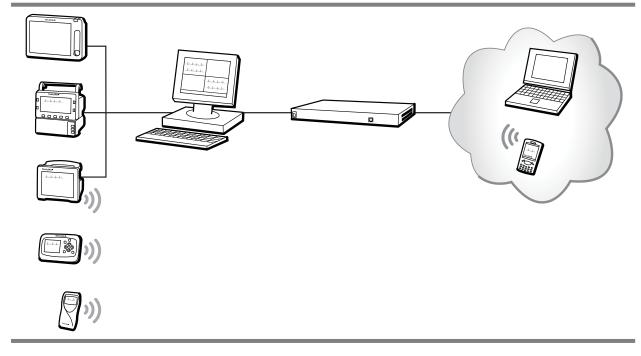

1 Introduction

Intended use

The Welch Allyn Connectivity Server (WACS) is an option to the Welch Allyn Acuity[®] Central Monitoring System. WACS consists of a server platform on which one or more of the following software options are installed:

- The Web Server option makes Adobe[®] Portable Document Format (PDF) printout files available from the Acuity System to certain Web browsers.
- The AcuityLink[®] option consists of Clinician Notifier software for non-proprietary mobile devices and administrative software for WACS. Mobile devices running the Clinician Notifier software deliver patient alarm information and realtime waveforms gathered from patient monitors connected to the Acuity[®] Central Monitoring System. The software enables administrators to track the status of clinician-patient assignments, and it enables clinicians to track, respond to and view Acuity System patient alarms, view realtime patient waveforms and view historical alarm details and waveforms.
- The HL7 Interface options support the following features using HL7 messaging protocol: export of vital signs data from the Acuity Central Monitoring System to hospital CIS/HIS systems, and import of ADT data from hospital clinical information systems/hospital information systems (CIS/HIS) to the Acuity System.
- The WACS Barcode Scanner option allows clinicians to enter patient IDs and room numbers into the Acuity System using barcode scanners on some mobile devices running Clinician Notifier software.
- The Third Party Data Stream Interface option supports sending patient alarms and equipment alerts in XML format to third party interfaces.

WACS is to be used by authorized health care professionals using standard institutional procedures and good clinical practice guidelines for patient monitoring. Staff training in the operation of WACS is essential for optimal use. Users should be skilled at the level of clinicians, clinical administrators and hospital administrators, with the knowledge and experience to acquire and interpret patients' vital signs. Each of these roles is assigned and associated with specific privileges and scopes. Access privileges are controlled through passwords.

Individuals using WACS should be familiar with its operation as described in this manual, and they should understand all warnings and cautions in the manual.

WARNING HL7 configuration must be performed only by qualified personnel who are familiar with the HL7 Standard and with local implementation of the WACS HL7 Interface. Improper configuration of the HL7 Interface can cause unexpected and unintended cessation of patient vital-signs data transfer.

Related to patient diagnosis and close physical surveillance



WARNING Welch Allyn Connectivity Server patient data is a subset of the patient data that is available at the Acuity Central Station. Do not solely use Welch Allyn Connectivity Server (WACS) data for patient diagnosis.

WARNING Do not rely solely on mobile devices running the Clinician Notifier program to indicate patient alarms and patient monitor equipment alerts. Always continue to monitor patients at patient monitors and the Acuity Central Station, and respond to patient monitor equipment alerts. In these examples, mobile devices do not indicate patient alarms:

- A clinician is not assigned to the mobile device.
- The mobile device is turned off or the battery is depleted.
- The assigned clinician is exited from the Clinician Notifier program.
- The assigned clinician is logged out of the Clinician Notifier program.
- The mobile device is not communicating with the Welch Allyn Connectivity Server.
- The Welch Allyn Connectivity Server is not communicating with the Acuity Central Station.
- The patient monitor is not communicating with the Acuity System.
- The patient is disconnected from the patient monitor.
- Your facility's AcuityLink Clinician Notifier option includes only the barcoding feature.

Cautions



Caution U. S. Federal law restricts this device to sale by or on the order of a physician.

Caution Do not upgrade a WACS system that is functioning improperly. Upgrading a malfunctioning system could cause configuration files to become missing or corrupted.

Notes

- **Note** Do not save patient reports on any unsecured or public computer. If the computer is not secure, always clear the disk cache after each user access.
- **Note** Each Welch Allyn Connectivity Server page opens at full speed after it has been accessed once.

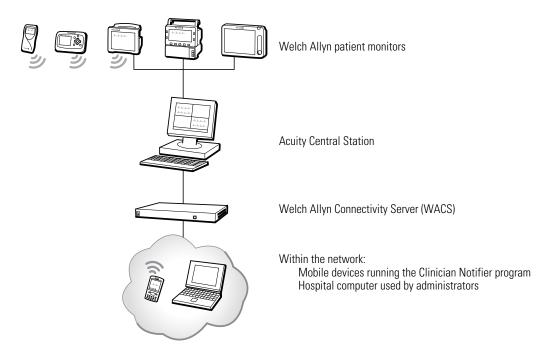

Welcome!

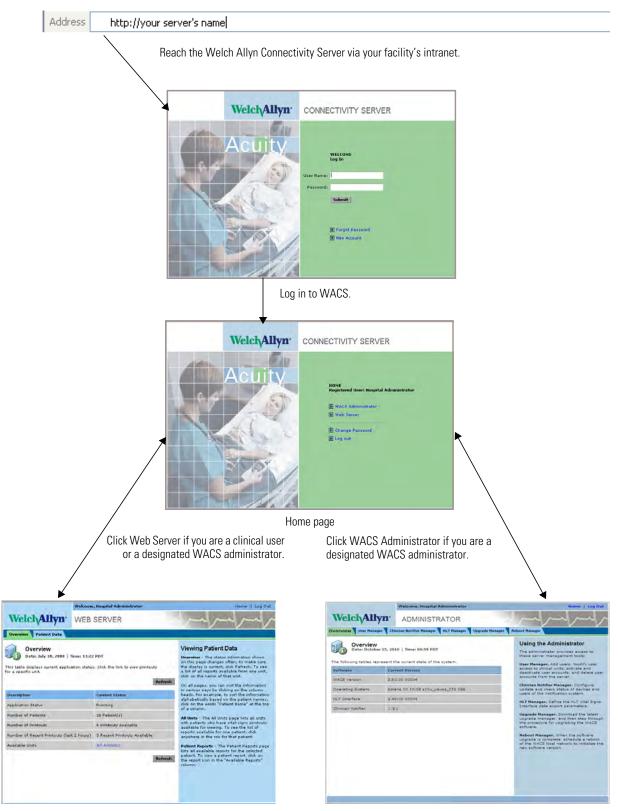


The Welch Allyn Connectivity Server (WACS) is an option to the Acuity Central Monitoring System (Acuity System). WACS supports a family of software applications for acute-care patient monitoring. We hope that you enjoy the expanded flexibility for patient monitoring that WACS provides.

The Welch Allyn Connectivity Server provides capability for these services.

- WACS Administrator module: Manage WACS configuration and WACS upgrades and manage clinician accounts and clinician privileges.
- WACS Web Server option: View and print historical printouts of Acuity System patients from a computer within your hospital information system network.
- WACS AcuityLink option: Receive and respond to secondary notification of Acuity System patient alarms via mobile devices running the Clinician Notifier program.
- WACS HL7 Interface and XML Interface options: Transfer patient admit/discharge/ transfer (ADT) information from your central or hospital information system network (CIS/HIS) to the Acuity System. Transfer numeric patient vital-signs data from the Acuity System to your CIS/HIS.

| C. Tabs | Navigate to a module within the WACS system. Users designated as administrators have access to more tabs than do users designated as clinicians. |
| D. Filter by Unit, Select Unit and Unit pull-down menus | Select Acuity System units that you would like to view. Units shown are units that you have been authorized to view. An $*$ designates "All Units." |
| E. Sorting mechanism | Click a column title to sort the list based on the column title. The title of the currently selected sort column is black. To reverse the sort order, click the title again. |
| F. Refresh | Click often to view the most current information. |
| G. Scroll bar | Drag the bar or click the arrow to scroll down the page. |

Access the WACS program Log In page

You can access the Welch Allyn Connectivity Server program via certain internet browsers on any computer in your facility's intranet.

To access the WACS Log In page

1. In the address field of your facility's internet browser, type the URL address of your facility's Welch Allyn Connectivity Server. For example:

If a security alert regarding certificates appears, you cannot continue the login process unless you respond. For details regarding this alert, please see the Troubleshooting chapter, "Troubleshooting WACS Login" on page 70.

2. Click Go, or press Enter on your keyboard.

Set up your WACS account

After you submit a request for a new WACS account, a designated WACS administrator must activate the account before it becomes functional.

To protect your WACS account, please consider implementing these suggestions:

- Set your browser to clear private data on exit.
- Disable your browser's Save Password setting.
- Disable your browser's Save Form Fields setting.
- Do not write down your password or store it on a computer.
- Each time that you leave the computer, log out of the WACS program or lock the computer screen.
- Change your password every two to eight weeks.

To become a designated WACS user for multiple WACS systems, you must set up an account for each Welch Allyn Connectivity Server that you wish to use.

Set up your WACS account

To set up your WACS account

1. Fill in the top seven fields with the appropriate information.

User names must be 4-16 alphanumeric characters, with no blanks or special characters.

Passwords must be 6-16 alphanumeric characters (at least three alphabetic and one numeric), with no blanks or special characters. Passwords are case-sensitive.

2. In the comments field, type a list, in this format:

Unit: WACS role that you are requesting

The following table illustrates available WACS roles and associated WACS privileges. For each unit, you can request one or more roles.

To request timely authorization of your request, talk with a designated WACS biomedical engineer if you are a clinical user or a designated WACS clinical administrator if you are an administrative user.



View Acuity System printout reports (Web Server option)

If your facility's Welch Allyn Connectivity Server includes the Web Server option, these features are available:

- Viewing of Acuity System patients' historical printout reports, via your facility's internet browser.
- Printout report viewing is accessible to designated WACS nurses, nurse managers and monitor technicians.
- Printout report viewing is accessible only from the WACS unit in which the reports were printed.
- **Note** Patient data transferring between the Welch Allyn Connectivity Server and your facility's CIS or HIS may be delayed when WACS is purging old files. The patient data transfers after WACS completes the purge.

View an overview of Acuity System patients and printouts

The Web Server Overview page summarizes the number of patients and available historical printout reports.

If the Web Server selection is not available, your WACS system does not include the Web Server option.

4. In the Available Reports column, click a report.

The report appears. If "Printout Not Available" appears, the report has been deleted.

Note Do not save patient reports on an unsecured or public computer. If the computer is not secure, always clear the disk cache after each user access.

Save or delete a historical printout report on WACS

WACS saves Acuity System patients' printout reports for a period of time configured by your system administrator or until the WACS disk is nearly full.

Designated WACS nurse managers can mark a report to indicate the following requests:

- Save the report beyond the typical retention period.
- Permanently delete the report within 15 minutes of marking.

Deleted reports cannot be recovered.

To save or permanently delete a printout report on WACS

1. Along the top of any WACS page, click **Home**. Click **Web Server**, and then click the **Patient Data** tab.

Configure the WACS HL7 Interface option

If your facility's Welch Allyn Connectivity Server includes an HL7 (Health Level 7) Interface option, software developers at your facility have programmed and configured the HL7 interface between your facility's CIS or HIS and WACS.

An HL7 Interface option can include one or both of these distinct modules:

- Inbound HL7 ADT Data module: Admit/discharge/transfer information (ADT) from your CIS or HIS to WACS. WACS uses the Acuity System network to send ADT information to the Acuity Central Monitoring System for storage.
- Outbound HL7 Vital-sign Observations module: Numeric patient vital-signs data from WACS to your facility-controlled clinical or hospital information system (CIS or HIS).

Using the WACS HL7 Manager pages shown in this chapter, designated WACS biomedical engineers can further configure the Outbound HL7 Vital-sign Observation settings for your facility.

If you are interested in reconfiguring Inbound HL7 ADT Data settings, please see the *Welch Allyn Connectivity Server (WACS) Programmer's Guide* and contact a Welch Allyn Technical Service representative. For contact information, see "Troubleshooting" on page 69).

AcuityLink Clinician Notifier alarm delivery modes

The WACS Event Delivery Mode determines how mobile devices receive patient alarms.

The setting applies to all mobile devices that are running Clinician Notifier software within an Acuity System unit.

Broadcast mode

In broadcast mode, WACS sends notification to all mobile devices in a unit simultaneously when an alarm occurs for any patient.

Violet Prince's patient monitor and the Acuity Central Station indicate that she is in an alarm state.

Seconds later, the alarm occurs on the mobile devices of primary responders— clinicians in the unit who have checked Violet Prince.

No one in the unit suspends her alarm tone.

11:00:30

Secondary notification

Violet's alarm tone continues at the bedside monitor and at the Acuity Central Station, and it escalates to mobile devices of secondary responders— clinicians in the unit who have checked Receive Secondary Notification.

No one in the unit suspends her alarm tone.

11:01:00 Broadcast notification

Violet's alarm tone continues at the patient monitor and at the Acuity Central Station, and it broadcasts to all active mobile devices in the unit.

Responsiveness and device battery life

| Problem | Explanation |

| The mobile device does not turn on. | It is possible that the battery or the internal backup battery of the mobile device is low or depleted, or that it has reached end of life. |
| | Replace the main battery and attempt to fully charge the device. If the problem continues, consult the mobile device manufacturer's directions for use. |
